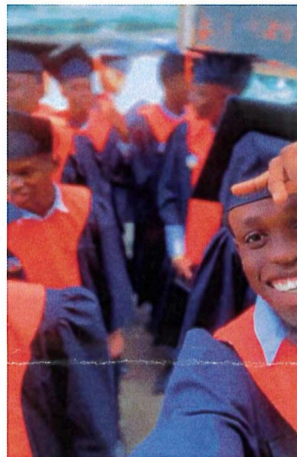

Limbé Compound Communications Project

One of the great challenges in our Haiti ministry is communication. Amid active ministry and preparations for the start of Aquila & Priscilla Institute and the potential expansion of other ministries, communication is key. In Haiti, however, communication is often difficult. We have decided to install a satellite internet system on our compound to enhance communication and, Lord willing, provide even more ministry opportunities. Of course, setting up such a system in Haiti is unique. In addition to the internet system itself, we also need to purchase a small solar system and batteries to keep the system up and running. Mexico Missions Teams & Special GMI-Mexico Gathering!

This month, several teams are headed to Mexico to assist our missionaries with building projects and teaching. At Alamos, a wall needs to be removed for more space and several rooms need to be rearranged so that they can be used for Bible Studies. Ministry has also been planned for Iglesia Hogar.

In addition, all three Oaxaca City churches and believers from the churches in Adequez and La Luz are gathering together at the start of the month of March for a special church service to celebrate the faithfulness and goodness of God in the region. The special weekend will also feature a Bible Apologetics Conference.
