Then He said to them, "Thus it is written, and thus it was necessary for the Christ to suffer and to rise from the dead the third day, and that repentance and remission of sins should be preached in His name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem."

-Luke 24:46-47 (NKJV)

These words, spoken by Christ following His resurrection from the dead and immediately before His ascension into heaven, establish several important truths both from the perspective of Christian doctrine and of practical Christian living. First, we understand that the death and resurrection of Christ were necessary for our redemption. Christ paid the debt of sin on the cross and rose from the grave in victory! Rather, it is to be heralded for what it is: The power of God to salvation for everyone who believes. Let us be grateful for the resurrection and the commission of Christ to shout the news of His Gospel from the rooftops! Praise God for His marvelous grace!

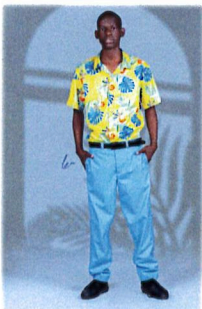

One Month Away...

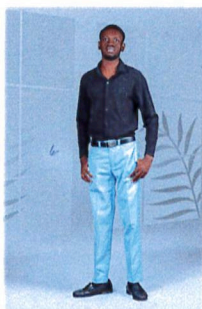
Our Grace Mission Graduates are only one month away from their graduation! Please pray for them as they prepare for this momentous celebration and get set for the future!

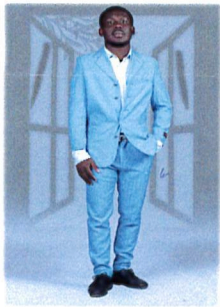

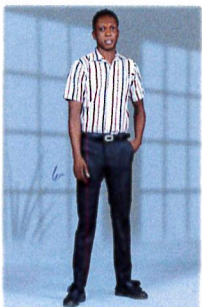

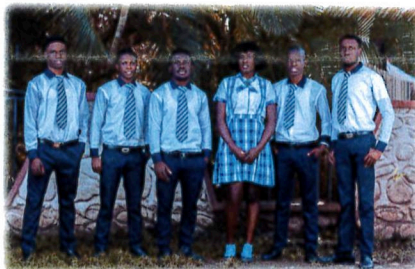
