He said to him the third time, “Simon, son of John, do you love Me?” Peter was grieved because He said to him the third time, “Do you love Me?” And he said to Him, “Lord, You know all things; You know that I love You.” Jesus said to him, “Tend my sheep.”

-John 21:17 (NASB)

This dialogue between the Savior and the Apostle Peter is one that seems to spark curiosity in the hearts and minds of many Christians. Why did Jesus prompt Peter to profess His love for Him three times? Why did Jesus repeat the command to care for His sheep three times as well? As Peter denied Christ three times only days prior, so also would he be convicted to state His love for the Savior three times. Just as Peter would be confronted by the risks of following Christ, so also he would be confronted by the risks of disobedience. Would he follow the Savior, or would he not? Friends, this question is equally important for us today. Will we do what our Savior says?

It is fascinating that each of the Gospels includes a commission directly connected to the proclamation of the Gospel and discipleship. The Great Commission commands are found in some form in Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:46-49; and John 21:15-17. From this, we can conclude that each of the Gospels ends with a call to tell others who Jesus is and what He has done. We may not have the same role as Peter or the other apostles, but we still have the privilege of serving our Lord with all our being.

You have been praying. We have been planning. God is always good. The last time Grace Mission sent any kind of team to Haiti was in January of 2024. That was over two years ago, and it has been the longest time we have been away from Haiti that we can remember. Sadly, it has been a record-breaking “Haiti Trip Drought.” The safety and security of the nation has been so volatile that we have simply been unable to travel in that timeframe. But, by the grace of our Lord, a team was able to travel at the end of April, and we are beyond excited to tell you all about it. But before we dig in, we want to thank you for your prayers and ask that you continue to pray for the security situation in Haiti. This month, it is our pleasure to bring you a special Haiti trip report!



We flew from Florida to Cap-Haitien with MFI (Missionary Flights International), arriving in Haiti around 10:30 AM on April 10th. MFI has helped us and so many others over the years, providing cargo and passenger transportation on many occasions. With the exception of our container shipment, every time we send items to Haiti, MFI is the organization that takes them across the sea. Their primary aircraft, the Douglas DC-3, makes the Caribbean crossing several times per week. We are so grateful for MFI!

One of several important meetings we had was with the API staff. Along with the leadership staff, made up of current Grace Mission Missionaries, we met with the new trades teachers, Farha, Remy, and Richard. Each of these teachers is a professional in their respective fields and has prior teaching experience. Welcome to Grace Mission’s Aquila & Priscilla Institute! Mr. Tidor, Mr. Guito, and several qualified guest teachers will be teaching Bible courses alongside the Trades and English courses, and Mr. Milius will direct the trades department. Please continue to pray for this ministry!
