We want to express our deepest gratitude for your prayerful support during the medical brigade we conducted in the Mixteca region. We witnessed God's faithfulness and mercy at every step of this trip, and we know that your prayers were a fundamental part of everything the Lord allowed us to accomplish.

God granted us the opportunity to visit two communities in this region, located approximately one hour apart: Santiago Buena Vista and Santiago Huaucilla. We were a team of 23 people comprised of dentists, doctors, nurses, doulas, and pastors from Mexico, the United States, and Canada, united by the desire to serve and share the love of Christ. In the evenings, we were blessed to participate in joint services, where

we were allowed to lead worship and share God's Word. My wife, Sara, ministered to the children, and during the consultations, we also had the opportunity to pray and share the gospel with many. Over the course of the journey, we witnessed the goodness of God on many occasions. With great joy, we saw 20 people make a decision for Christ. In total, over 250 medical/dental consultations were conducted, and people gave their lives to Christ. One of the most moving testimonies was that of a former Catholic priest who, years earlier, had resigned his position to start a family. Since then, he had lived carrying guilt and rejection, which even affected his health. With tears and profound joy, he received the gift of salvation and expressed his desire to continue learning from the Word of God, requesting that we visit him again. Indeed, in both communities, we were sent off with much gratitude. We returned deeply grateful and moved by all that the Lord allowed us to experience during these weeks. God has been good and faithful at all times. We continue to pray that the Lord will allow us to continue this work and return to these communities to continue serving and sharing the love of Christ.
